Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 24 of chapter 151A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (b) the following new
- 3 subsection:-
- 4 (b1/2) Be willing to accept work when the offered position is considered reasonably
- 5 relative to the position previously held by the claimant, the type of work offered is such that the
- 6 claimant is capable of performing, and/or there is no medical reason restricting the claimant from
- 7 the offered position.
