In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to stakeholder data advisory group recommendations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Chapter 70 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition, is hereby
2	amended by inserting after section 4 the following section:-

3 Section 4A. (a) The department of elementary and secondary education, in consultation 4 with the executive office of education, shall a convene data advisory committee to promote the 5 improved use of school-level data to inform effective resource allocation decisions at the local 6 level. The data advisory committee shall include, but not be limited to, a representative from the 7 following organizations: the Massachusetts Association of School Committees, Inc.; the 8 Massachusetts Association of School Superintendents, Inc.; the Massachusetts Association of 9 School Business Officials, Inc.; the Massachusetts Association of Vocational Administrators, 10 Inc.; and the Massachusetts Association of Regional Schools, Inc. The data advisory committee 11 shall assist the department to identify, advise and analyze cost-effective ways to achieve the 12 following goals including, but not limited to:

(i) streamlining financial reporting, eliminate duplicate reporting requirements and
improve data quality;

(ii) strengthening the department's capacity to analyze and report staffing, scheduling and
financial data in ways that support strategic resource allocation decisions at the district and
school level;

(iii) strengthening district capacity to use data to make strategic resource allocationdecisions; and

20 (iv) how to establish a data collection and reporting system that:

(1) tracks funding allocated for English language learner and low-income students to
ensure that spending is targeted to the intended populations and to provide a data source for the
foundation budget review commission about the accuracy and adequacy of the low-income and
English language learner increments; and

(2) allows for access to school-level expenditures and data across all districts to inform
 the public and policy-makers about effective school-level interventions and investments.

The data advisory committee shall report its progress to the board, the chairs of the joint committee on education and the house and senate committees on ways and means not less than semi-annually, by December 1 and June 1 of each year, and shall make recommendations as are necessary for the department to achieve the goals outlined in this section. The department may, in consultation with the data advisory group, develop or procure the data collection and reporting system under clause (iv).
