In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act designating inflammatory breast cancer awareness day.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section
- 2 15RRRRR, the following section:—
- 3 Section 15SSSSS. The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart October
- 4 18 as Inflammatory Breast Cancer Awareness Day to raise awareness of the occurrence of
- 5 inflammatory breast cancer and to encourage regular testing for inflammatory breast cancer
- 6 amongst all citizens of the commonwealth and recommending that the day be observed in an
- 7 appropriate manner by the people.
