In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to tax title expense.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 62 of chapter 60 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "charges", in line 17, the
- 3 following words:-, which shall include all legal fees incurred to date.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 65 of said chapter 60, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
- 5 placing at the end of the section the following sentence:- A city or town may add all legal fees
- 6 incurred to date to the tax title account of the land to which the right of redemption is being
- 7 foreclosed.
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 79 of said chapter 60, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
- 9 striking out, in lines 9, 13, 55 and 65 the words "fifty dollars" and inserting in place thereof, in
- each instance, the following words:- \$500 or actual costs, whichever is less.
