In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to fundraisers for injured first responders.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECITON 1. Chapter 268A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof, the following new section:—
- 3 Section 30. Nothing contained in this chapter shall be construed to prohibit fundraisers,
- 4 donations, or solicitations of donations for the benefit of a public employee who is a first
- 5 responder who becomes temporarily or permanently disabled by reason of injuries sustained
- 6 through no fault of the public employee while acting in an official capacity. A fundraiser for
- 7 such purposes may mention the public employee's title and position as a public employee.
