**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act updating gateway municipalities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 23A of the General Laws is hereby amended in Section 3A by striking out-

2 "Gateway municipality", a municipality with a population greater than 35,000 and less
3 than 250,000, a median household income below the commonwealth's average and a rate of
4 educational attainment of a bachelor's degree or above that is below the commonwealth's
5 average.

6 and inserting the following-

7 "Gateway municipality", a municipality with a population greater than 35,000 and less
8 than 250,000, or two or more municipalities forming an inter-municipal agreement for this
9 purpose with a combined population greater than 35,000 and less than 250,000, a median
10 household income below the commonwealth's average and a rate of educational attainment of a
11 bachelor's degree or above that is below the commonwealth's average.
