By Mr. Dooley of Norfolk (by request), a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of Jack Gianino relative to the operation of personal watercrafts. Environment, Natural Resources and Agriculture.

An Act relative to the operation of personal watercrafts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 90B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official
2 Edition, is hereby amended by striking out section 1 and inserting in place thereof the following
3 section:-

4 Section 1. In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, the following words shall
5 have the following meanings:

6 “Amphibious landing vehicle”, a motor vehicle that can travel on land and water.

7 “Boating accident”, an occurrence in which a waterborne vessel subject to this chapter is
8 involved, whether or not there has been any actual collision, and which results in damage by or
9 to such vessel or its equipment, or by or to an object or person being towed, pushed or propelled
10 by such vessel, or in which there is an injury to any person, loss of life, or disappearance of any
11 person under circumstances which indicate the possibility of death or injury or disappearance of
12 a vessel other than by theft.

“Certificate of Number”, a document issued by the director, upon application therefor, stating the name and address of the owner of, and the number awarded to a vessel subject to this chapter, except such vessels, other than livery boats, owned by a manufacturer of or dealer in boats.

“Commissioner”, the commissioner of the department of fisheries, wildlife and environmental law enforcement.

“Department”, the department of fisheries, wildlife and environmental law enforcement of the executive office of environmental affairs.

“Director”, the director of the division of law enforcement of the department of fisheries, wildlife and environmental law enforcement.

“Division”, the division of law enforcement of the department of fisheries, wildlife and environmental law enforcement.

“Horsepower”, the aggregate rated horsepower of all propellant machinery at maximum operating revolutions per minute.

“Identification number”, the number awarded to a vessel subject to this chapter and upon approval of an application for a certificate of number.

“Length”, the extreme deck fore-and-aft measurement of a vessel.

“Like offense”, as used in subsection (a) of section eight, shall mean any violation of paragraph (1) of subsection (a) of section eight, or any violation of subparagraph (1) of paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section twenty-four of chapter ninety.

“Livery boat”, a boat hired or available for hire from a person who offers boats for hire as a regular business.

“Machinery”, all inboard and outboard engines and all other types of motors or mechanical devices capable of propelling vessels.

“Motorboat”, any vessel propelled by machinery whether or not such machinery is the principal source of propulsion, but not a vessel which has a valid marine document issued by the Bureau of Customs of the United States government or any federal agency successor thereto.

“Operate”, navigate or otherwise use a motorboat or vessel.

“Operator”, a person who operates or who has a charge of the navigation or use of a motorboat or vessel.

“Owner”, the person who claims lawful possession of a vessel by virtue of legal title or equitable interest therein which entitles him to possession.

“Person”, a natural person, corporation, association, partnership or other legal entity or other legal agency or political subdivision.

“Personal flotation devices”, TYPE I, a coast guard approved device designed to turn an unconscious person in the water from a face downward position to a vertical or slightly backward position, and to have more than twenty pounds of buoyancy. Acceptable for all size boats. TYPE II, a coast guard approved device designed to turn an unconscious person in the water from a face downward position to a vertical or slightly backward position and to have at least fifteen and five-tenths pounds of buoyancy. Acceptable for all size boats. TYPE III, a coast guard approved device designed to keep a conscious person in a vertical or slightly backward

position and to have at least fifteen and five-tenths pounds of buoyancy. While having the same buoyancy as TYPE II, the TYPE III has a lesser turning ability to allow for a comfortable design for water activities such as water skiing. Acceptable for all size boats. TYPE IV, a coast guard approved device designed to be thrown to a person in the water and not worn. It is designed to have at least sixteen and five-tenths pounds of buoyancy. Acceptable for all boats as a throwable device only.

“Personal watercraft”, any motorized watercraft that is 16 feet or less in hull length as manufactured, uses an outboard motor or an inboard motor powering a water jet pump as its primary source of power, and is designed to be operated by a person sitting, standing, kneeling on or being towed behind the vessel, rather than the conventional manner of sitting or standing inside the vessel. “Personal watercraft” shall include, but not be limited to, a jet ski, wet bike, surf jet, fun ski and miniature speedboat. “Personal watercraft” shall also include motorized watercraft whose operation is controlled by a water skier. “Personal watercraft” shall not include a motorized watercraft that does not have a horsepower rating greater than 15 horsepower and does not generate an unreasonable amount of noise.

“Registrar”, the registrar of motor vehicles.

“Secretary”, the Secretary of the Department of the United States government in which the coast guard is operating.

“Ship's lifeboats”, boats carried aboard a vessel and used solely for lifesaving purposes, but not including dinghies, tenders, speedboats or other types of craft carried aboard a vessel and used for other than lifesaving purposes.

“Underway”, not an anchor, made fast to the shore or aground.

76 “Vessel”, watercraft of every description, except a seaplane on the water used or capable
77 of being used as a means of transportation on water.

78 “Waters of the commonwealth”, all coastal and inland waters as defined in section one of
79 chapter one hundred and thirty-one except ponds less than ten acres in area and owned by one
80 person, and is not open to the public.

81 SECTION 2. Section 9A of said chapter 90B, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
82 striking out, in line 1, the words “jet ski, surf jet or wetbike” and inserting in place thereof the
83 following words:- a personal watercraft.

84 SECTION 3. Section 9A of chapter 90B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016
85 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word “sunrise”, in lines 6 and 7, the
86 following clause:- or (f) without having completed the educational safety program required for
87 the operation of personal watercrafts pursuant to section 9B of this chapter.

88 SECTION 4. Said section 9A of said chapter 90B, as so appearing, hereby further
89 amended by striking out, in lines 8 and 9 the following words:- , jet ski, surf jet or wetbike.

90 SECTION 5. Section 9B of said chapter 90B, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
91 striking out, in lines 3 and 4, the words “jet ski, surf jet or wetbike.” and inserting in place
92 thereof the following words:- personal watercrafts.

93 SECTION 6. Said section 9B of said chapter 90B, as so appearing, is hereby further
94 amended by striking out the following words:- under the age of eighteen.

95 SECTION 7. Said section 9B of said chapter 90B, as so appearing, is hereby further
96 amended by inserting, in line 5, after the word “in” the following words:- and successfully
97 complete.

98 SECTION 8. Said section 9B of said chapter 90B, as so appearing, is hereby further
99 amended by adding the following sentence:- All persons operating a personal watercraft shall be
100 required to carry the certificate granted upon completion of this program with them while
101 operating said watercrafts at all times.
