*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 234A of the Massachusetts General Laws, Part III, Title II, “Section 42:
- 2 ENFORCEMENT OF CHAPTER,” is hereby amended by striking and repealing the amount of
- 3 potential civil fine of “not more than two thousand dollars” and adding “not more than twenty-
- 4 five dollars.”
