In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)

An Act to ensure adequate handicapped parking.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 22A of chapter 40 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by striking out the second sentence of the second paragraph and inserting in
3 place thereof the following sentence:-

4 Parking spaces designated as restricted under this paragraph shall be no less than five
5 percent of the parking spaces regulated by a city or town on ways within its control and shall be
6 identified by the use of above-grade signs with white lettering against a blue background and
7 shall bear the words “Handicapped Parking: Special Plate Required.
