The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

Resolve establishing an enhanced public school safety commission.

1 Resolved, There is hereby established a special commission pursuant to section 2A of 2 chapter 4 of the General Laws to study enhanced school safety. The commission shall consist of 3 15 members: the house and senate chairs of the joint committee on education, or their designees; 4 the house and senate chairs of the joint committee on public safety, or their designees; the 5 minority leader of the house of representatives, or a designee; the minority leader of the senate, 6 or a designee; the Fire Marshal of the commonwealth, or a designee; the Chief of Police of the 7 city of Boston, or designee; a chief of police from a town with less than 25,000 residents, to be 8 appointed by the Massachusetts Chiefs of Police Association; a fire chief from a town with less 9 than 25,000 residents, to be appointed by the Fire Chiefs Association of Massachusetts; a 10 representative of the Massachusetts Association of School Superintendents, a representative of 11 the Massachusetts Association of School Committees, a school resource officer currently 12 employed in the commonwealth, appointed by the Massachusetts Juvenile Police Officer's

13	Association; the secretary of the executive office of public safety, or a designee; a representative
14	from the Massachusetts School Building Authority, appointed by the executive director.
15	The commission shall study the need for enhanced safety and emergency preparedness in
16	the public schools of the commonwealth, which study shall include, but not be limited to, the
17	following topics:
18	Secure school entrances and vestibules
19	Enhanced Telecommunication between school administration and public safety agencies
20	Video monitoring of classrooms
21	Use of interlocking devices in classrooms
22	Bullet-proof windows in schools
23	Classroom door policy
24	Use of retired local and state police personnel as School Resource Officers.
25	The ALICE (Alert-Lockdown-Inform-Counter-Evacuate) Program
26	The commission shall submit a report of its findings along with any recommendations
27	and suggested legislative or executive actions to the joint committee on public safety and to the
28	joint committee on education and the clerks of the house of representatives and the senate no
29	later than 1 year after the first meeting of the commission.
