An Act to protect rental car customers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition, is hereby  
2 amended by inserting the following new section:-

3 Section 32E3/4A. If a rental company includes a fee for electronic tolls incurred by the  
4 driver as a charge in a rental transaction, the amount of the fee shall represent the actual cost of  
5 the tolls and rental company's good faith estimate of actual costs necessary for the rental  
6 company to recover the tolls incurred by the driver. No rental company may charge a rental fee  
7 for an electronic tolling transponder.

8 A violation of this section shall constitute a violation of Chapter 93A.
