An Act relative to one day alcoholic beverage licenses.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 14 of Chapter 138 of the Massachusetts General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by adding the following after the first sentence:-

3 No person, firm, corporation, association, or other combination of persons, directly or  
4 indirectly, or through any agent, employee, stockholder, officer or other person or any subsidiary  
5 whatsoever, shall be granted, in the aggregate, more than 14 such licenses in the commonwealth  
6 in a calendar year, or participate in decisions regarding such licenses or receive any percentage  
7 or fee derived from gross revenues in exchange for management assistance, or participate in any  
8 other action designed to effect common results of more than 14 license under this section in a  
9 calendar year.
