In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to line of duty death benefits.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1 SECTION 1. Section 100A of Chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016

2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "death", in line 12, the following

3 words:-; provided that, the words "killed in the line of duty" shall include any public safety

4 employee, as defined in this subsection, whose death is self-inflicted and a licensed mental health

5 professional, as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 123, establishes that the death was the direct

6 result of exposure to a traumatic event or set of events in the course of the employee's active

7 duty service.
