In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act authorizing tax free contributions to a trust for the care of incapacitated persons.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 62 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by inserting after section 6N the following section:—

3	Section 60. A parent or guardian of a person who is disabled, as defined in the federal
4	Social Security Act, 42 U.S.C. subsection 1382c (a)(3)(A), may contribute an amount not to
5	exceed ten percent of his gross income to a supplemental needs trust for the care of such disabled
6	person and such contribution shall be exempt from taxation under the provisions of this chapter.
7	For purposes of this paragraph, a "supplemental needs trust" shall mean a trust used to provide a
8	supplemental source for payment of goods and services that are otherwise unavailable from any
9	publicly funded benefit program or to provide a higher quality of care than is otherwise
10	available.
