**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act relative to civics education.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, all school
2 districts shall submit to the Joint Committee on Education, the House and Senate Committee on
3 Ways and Means, and the Clerks of the House and the Senate their plans to implement a
4 culturally competent civics education curriculum including but not limited to the history and
5 contributions of: women, people of color, immigrants, the civil rights movement, the women's
6 suffrage movement, native peoples, religious minorities, the LGBT community, veterans, and
7 other underrepresented groups in history, by June 30, 2019.
