An Act relative to identification for the sale of alcoholic beverages.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 34B of chapter 138 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the words “foreign country,” in line 19, the
3 following:- a valid license to operate a motor vehicle issued by another state,

4 SECTION 2. Said section 34B of chapter 138, as so appearing, is hereby further amended
5 by striking out, in lines 25 through 27, inclusive, the words “a liquor purchase identification
6 card, or an identification card issued under section 8E of Chapter 90, or motor vehicle license
7 issued pursuant to said section eight”, and inserting in place thereof the following:- identification
8 permitted by this section
