An Act ensuring students' access to academic transcripts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Chapter 15A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official Edition, is hereby
2	amended by adding the following section:-

3	Section 19F. (a) Institutions of higher education shall not withhold a student's unofficial
4	academic transcript solely due to the student's failure to pay any loan payments, fines, fees,
5	tuition, or other expenses owed to the institution, except that a student's academic credits and
6	grades may be withheld for any course for which the student's tuition and mandatory courses
7	fees are not paid in full. For students paying on a per semester basis, an institution may withhold
8	a student's academic credits or grades for any course taken in a semester for which the student's
9	tuition and mandatory course fees have not been paid.
