The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act to promote asset building for low income residents.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general law or special law or regulation to the
- 2 contrary, the department of transitional assistance shall not employ the use of an assets test to
- determine an assistance unit's financial eligibility for cash assistance under transitional aid to
- 4 families with dependent children. Financial eligibility for cash assistance shall be based solely on
- 5 an income test under 106 CMR 704.210 or other relevant regulation promulgated by the
- 6 department.
- 7 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
