#### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relating to contribution fairness.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 7A of chapter 55 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (c) the following new subsection:-
- 3 (d) If not otherwise limited or prohibited from making contributions under this chapter,
- 4 the aggregate of all contributions by any group, association, labor union or other entity for the
- 5 benefit of any one candidate and such candidate's committee shall not exceed \$1,000 in a
- 6 calendar year. If not otherwise limited or prohibited from making contributions under this
- 7 chapter, the aggregate of all contributions by any group, association, labor union or other entity
- 8 for the benefit of any other political committee, other than a ballot question committee, shall not
- 9 exceed \$1,000 in a calendar year.
