The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act creating a commission to study Willet Pond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, there is hereby established a
2	commission to study whether Willett Pond and its appurtenances should be deeded to the state
3	department of Conservation and Recreation at no cost to the Commonwealth in order to provide
4	new public access for outdoor recreation and to preserve the species and ecosystem of said pond.
5	The commission shall include a representative or designee from the Executive office of
6	Energy and Environmental Affairs, a representative or designee from the department of
7	Conservation & Recreation, a representative or designee from the Boards of Selectmen of the
8	towns of Walpole, Westwood, and Norwood; a representative or designee from the Willet Pond
9	Charitable and Protective Association; a representative or designee from the North Walpole Fish
10	and Game Club; a representative or designee from the Neponset River Watershed Association.
11	The commission shall make its findings and submit same to the Secretary of the Executive

- 12 Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs, the clerks of the house and senate on or before June
- 13 30, 2019.
