An Act to study disparities in health care resulting from changes in marital status.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the  
2           contrary, the Center for Health Information and Analysis is hereby directed and authorized to  
3           conduct a comprehensive study to investigate disparities in the provision of health care coverage  
4           to individuals and/or their spouses when there is a change in marital status. Said study shall  
5           include, but not be limited to, the identification and review of said disparities in both insured and  
6           self-insured plans, as well as recommendations for alleviating disparities. The Center shall  
7           provide an opportunity for interested parties to submit relevant testimony. The Center shall file a  
8           report of its study, including recommendations and drafts of any legislation, if necessary, with  
9           the clerks of the Senate and House of Representatives within one year of the effective date of this  
10          act.
