An Act relative to newborn enrollment in MassHealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Chapter 118E of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition, is hereby
2	amended by inserting after Section 9F the following section:
3	Section 9G. Newborn enrollment
4	(a) In the case of a newborn(s) born to a mother who is covered by MassHealth at the
5	time of birth and who will be required to enroll in managed care, the newborn(s) shall initially be
6	enrolled in MassHealth fee-for-service from the date of birth until a parent or guardian selects a
7	managed care plan, provided that if no such selection is made during the first forty-five days of
8	life, on day forty-six, the newborn may be assigned to a managed care plan by the Secretary who
9	shall give preference to assigning the infant to the same managed care plan as that of other
10	children in the household or of either parent or guardian.
