An Act relative to saving lives.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 35 of chapter 123 of the Massachusetts General Laws is hereby  
2 further amended by inserting after the third paragraph the following paragraph:- "When the  
3 court is closed for business, upon filing of a petition by a person authorized to do so under the  
4 second paragraph, a justice of the court may order a person to be committed to a facility  
5 designated by the department of public health if the court finds that the person is an individual  
6 with a substance use disorder and finds that there is a grave likelihood of serious harm as a result  
7 of the person's substance use disorder; provided, however, that at the next available opportunity,  
8 or at the next business day, whichever is sooner, the person shall receive a hearing in accordance  
9 with the preceding paragraph; and provided further, that an order issued pursuant to this  
10 paragraph shall expire not more than 72 hours after the issuance of the order, at which point the  
11 person committed shall be immediately released from commitment or transported to the court for  
12 a hearing. The court may adopt rules and procedures to implement this paragraph"
