### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act reducing tobacco sales to minors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 6 of Chapter 270 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking subsections (d) and (e) and inserting in place
- 3 thereof the following subsections:-
- 4 (d) Each person selling or distributing tobacco products shall verify the age of the
- 5 purchaser by means of government-issued photographic identification containing the bearer's
- date of birth that the purchaser is 21 years old or older. Verification is required for any person,
- 7 regardless of age.
- 8 (e) A person who violates this section shall be punished by a fine of \$1,000 for the first
- 9 offense, \$2,000 for a second offense and \$5,000 for a third or subsequent offense.
- 10 (f) The department of public health may promulgate regulations to implement this
- 11 section.
