An Act establishing a sick leave bank for Kara Turco, an employee of the Middlesex County Sherriff's Department.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Notwithstanding any general or special law or rule or regulation to the contrary, the  
2 Middlesex County Sheriff's Department shall establish a sick leave bank for Kara Turco, an  
3 employee of the sheriff's department. Any employee of the Middlesex county sheriff's  
4 department may voluntarily contribute 1 or more sick days to the sick leave bank for use by Kara  
5 Turco. Sick leave bank days shall not be used for absences unrelated to the illness or disability  
6 that necessitated the establishment of the sick leave bank as determined by the sheriff's  
7 department. Whenever Kara Turco terminates employment with the sheriff's department or  
8 requests to dissolve the sick leave bank, any remaining time in the sick leave bank shall be  
9 transferred to the extended illness leave bank.
