An Act relative to elevator certificates.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 62 of Chapter 143 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended, by adding at the end thereof the following sentence:-

3 "Notwithstanding any general or special law or rule or regulation to the contrary, it is
4 unlawful for anyone to operate an elevator without a certificate of inspection."
