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By Mr. Garballey of Arlington, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1265) of Sean Garballey for an investigation by a special commission relative to the transparency and affordability of the Group Insurance Commission. Health Care Financing.

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## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

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In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court  
(2021-2022)  
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An Act to create a special commission to improve transparency and affordability at the Group Insurance Commission.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           There shall be a special commission governed by section 2A of chapter 4 of the General  
2   Laws to: (i) assess public transparency at the Group Insurance Commission with respect to its  
3   procurement and contracting processes; (ii) make recommendations to improve transparency at  
4   the Group Insurance Commission including, but not limited to, requiring the public disclosure of  
5   its vendor contracts involving health care costs and pharmaceutical pricing; (iii) evaluate the  
6   potential use of reference based pricing as a means of making medical costs through the Group  
7   Insurance Commission affordable and uniform; (iv) investigate the value and viability of a public  
8   option health insurance plan available to public and non-public employees in the Commonwealth  
9   of Massachusetts. The commission shall file its findings and recommendations, together with  
10   drafts of legislation necessary to carry those recommendations into effect, with the clerks of the  
11   senate and the house of representatives, the chairs of the senate and house committees on public

12 service and the chairs of the senate and house committees on health care financing not later than  
13 December 1, 2021.

14 The commission shall consist of 1 member who shall be appointed by the senate  
15 president, who shall serve as co-chair; 1 member who shall be appointed by the minority leader  
16 of the senate; 1 member who shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives,  
17 who shall serve as co-chair; 1 member who shall be appointed by the minority leader of the  
18 house of representatives; the secretary of administration and finance or a designee; and 1  
19 member to be appointed by each of the following organizations: the Massachusetts Teachers  
20 Association; the American Federation of Teachers, Massachusetts; the Retired State, County and  
21 Municipal Employees Association of Massachusetts; the Massachusetts Public Employees  
22 Council, #93, AFSCME, Massachusetts State Labor Council, AFL CIO; Massachusetts State  
23 Employees Association, NAGE; the Massachusetts Municipal Association; the Massachusetts  
24 Chapter of the AFL CIO; and the Massachusetts Organization of State Engineers and Scientists.
