**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act relative to senior and non-elderly disabled housing.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Within 45 days after the effective date of this act, a 15-member advisory
2 commission shall be established to study the best practices and safety protocols of state
3 subsidized senior and non-elderly disabled housing. The advisory committee shall consist of the
4 following members: two members selected by the Governor of the Commonwealth; four
5 members selected by the Speaker of the House; four members selected by the Senate President;
6 one member selected by the Citizens Housing and Planning Association; one member selected
7 by the Massachusetts Chapter of the National Association of Housing and Redevelopment
8 Officials; one member selected by the Mass Union of Public Housing Tenants; one member
9 selected by the Disability Law Center; one member selected by the Massachusetts Municipal
10 Association.
