An Act relative to the protection of the families of violent crime from intimidation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION XXX. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the  
2   Secretary of the Executive office of Public Safety, in consultation with the Judiciary and the  
3   Trial Court, shall make recommendations for the protection of the families of victims of violent  
4   crime, both in and outside of court, from intimidation and taunting. The report may make  
5   recommendations for civil or criminal penalties. The Secretary shall file these recommendations  
6   with the House and Senate Chairs of the Joint Committee on Judiciary and the Clerks of the  
7   House and Senate on or before January 15, 2022.
