**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act relative to organic farming tools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 6A of Chapter 132B is hereby amended by adding:

3 The department and the Pesticide Control Board shall authorize the application on hemp
4 and marijuana of biological and botanical pesticide products that are considered appropriate for
5 organic farming, provided that the EPA allows application of the product’s active and inert
6 ingredients on food and tobacco crops and has not established a federal tolerance limit. In
7 implementing this provision, the Department of Agricultural Resources shall consider the
8 pesticide regulations and guidance of other cannabis and hemp legalization states, including

- 9 Colorado, California and Oregon, shall avoid inclusion of genetically modified products, and
- 10 shall develop guidance or regulations implementing this provision.
