An Act relative to the burial of pets.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 114 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2020 Official Edition,  
2 is hereby amended by adding the following section:-

3           Section 52. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, a town, city,  
4 cemetery corporation or other entity legally responsible for the maintenance or operation of a  
5 cemetery or burial place may allow co-interment of both human and animal remains, including  
6 but not limited to cremated remains. Such entity may issue their own policies on fees, interments,  
7 and other requirements.
