In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court

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An Act relative to the sustainability of public health dental hygienists through adequate reimbursements.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1           Section 1: Section 51 of Chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012  
2   Official Edition, is hereby amended in line 60 by striking out, “by Medicaid but except as  
3   required by federal Medicaid law, shall not seek reimbursement from any other insurance or  
4   third party payor.”
