An Act relative to expanding the availability of adaptable housing for consumers with disabilities, mobility impairments, and seniors.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. The first paragraph of section 13A of chapter 22 of the General Laws, as  
2 appearing in the 2018 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the fourth paragraph,  
3 consisting of lines 38 through 63, and inserting in place thereof the following four paragraphs:

4           The board shall make and from time to time alter, amend, and repeal, in accordance with  
5 the provisions of chapter thirty A, rules and regulations designed to make multiple dwellings and  
6 public buildings accessible to, functional for and safe for use by persons with disabilities. The  
7 board shall also make rules and regulations requiring that any person who has lawful control of  
8 improved or enclosed private property used as off-street parking areas where the public has a  
9 right of access as invitees or licensees, shall reserve parking spaces in said off-street parking  
10 areas for vehicles authorized to display handicapped plates or placards under section 2 of chapter  
11 90; provided, that the parking requirements shall be consistent with the Americans with

12 Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design. The parking spaces reserved for vehicles of  
13 such handicapped persons shall be clearly marked as such.

14         The rules and regulations of the board shall also establish standards and procedures  
15 designed to make adaptable for persons with physical disabilities for any building, regardless of  
16 the date of construction, (1) all dwelling units in multiple dwellings equipped with an elevator;  
17 (2) all ground floor dwelling units in multiple dwellings not equipped with an elevator; and (3)  
18 all public use and common use portions of such multiple dwellings, providing however, that in  
19 any building constructed before March thirteenth, nineteen hundred and ninety one, such  
20 standards and procedures for dwelling units shall apply only to such units within (1) any non-  
21 residential building undergoing a gut rehabilitation as part of a change in use into a multiple  
22 dwelling facility, or (2) any residential building which is vacant undergoing a gut rehabilitation.

23         The rules and regulations of the board shall establish standards and procedures designed  
24 to make accessible to, functional for and safe for use by persons with physical disabilities  
25 residential buildings whenever constructed and without the restrictions in the above paragraph.  
26 Unless otherwise specified, five percent of the units in lodging or residential facilities for hire,  
27 rent or lease, containing twenty or more units, shall meet this requirement; provided, however,  
28 that accessible units shall allow five feet of turning radius for a wheelchair in the kitchens and  
29 bathrooms. In the event that the board determines that the need, in certain areas of the  
30 commonwealth, for such units either exceeds or does not require said five percent, the board may  
31 require that, in said areas a percentage of units less than five percent or not greater than ten  
32 percent be accessible and safe for persons with disabilities; provided, however, that said  
33 accessible units shall allow five feet of turning radius for a wheelchair in the kitchens and  
34 bathrooms. The board may make such determination only if there is sufficient factual basis,

35 using data from the central registry of the Massachusetts Rehabilitation Commission and other  
36 sources, to establish with a reasonable degree of certainty the present and future needs for said  
37 accessible units in certain areas of the commonwealth. A percentage of less than five percent  
38 shall not be established unless such accessible units, which are not needed by persons with  
39 disabilities cannot be readily hired, rented, or leased to other persons.

40 The rules and regulations of the board shall include, but not be limited to, detailed  
41 architectural standards further defining adaptable and accessible dwelling units, and such other  
42 provisions necessary to provide rights and remedies substantially equivalent to or greater than  
43 the rights and remedies provided by the federal Fair Housing Act, the Department of Justice's  
44 Americans with Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design and regulations thereunder as  
45 they pertain to such multiple dwellings.

46 SECTION 2. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
47 amended by striking out, in lines 11 and 12, the words "in behalf of the physically handicapped"  
48 and inserting in place thereof the following words:-

49 "on behalf of persons with disabilities".

50 SECTION 3. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
51 amended by inserting after the word "buildings", in line 67, the following words:-

52 "and facilities".

53 SECTION 4. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
54 amended by inserting after the word "buildings", in line 75, the following words:-

55 "and facilities".

56 SECTION 5. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
57 amended by striking out, in lines 80 and 81, the words “handicapped persons,” and inserting in  
58 place thereof the following words:-

59 "persons with a disability.

60 SECTION 6. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
61 amended by striking out, in lines 88 and 89 the word “newspaper” and inserting in place thereof  
62 the following words:-

63 "forms of".

64 SECTION 7. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
65 amended by inserting after the word “building”, in line 93, the following words:-

66 "or facility".

67 SECTION 8. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
68 amended by inserting after the word “building”, in line 94, the following words:-

69 "or facility".

70 SECTION 9. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
71 amended by inserting after the word “changed to a”, in line 94, the following words:-

72 "residential use or a".

73 SECTION 10. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
74 amended by inserting, in line 94, after the words “which the building” the following words:-

75 "or facility."

76 SECTION 11. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
77 amended by inserting after the word "building", in line 96, the following words:-

78 "or facility".

79 SECTION 12. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
80 amended by striking out, in lines 102 and 103, the words "physically handicapped persons" and  
81 inserting in place thereof the following words:-

82 "persons with a disability".

83 SECTION 13. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
84 amended by striking out the eighth paragraph, consisting of lines 107 through 127.

85 SECTION 14. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
86 amended by striking out, in lines 131 and 132, the word "person" and inserting in place thereof  
87 the following words:-

88 "building, or portion thereof,".

89 SECTION 15. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
90 amended by inserting after the words "for a building", in line 150, the following words:-

91 "or facility".

92 SECTION 16. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
93 amended by inserting after the word "building", in line 166, the following word:-

94           ", facility".

95           SECTION 17. Said section 13A of said chapter 32, as so appearing, is hereby further  
96 amended by striking out, in lines 177, 179 and 187 the words "physically handicapped persons"  
97 and inserting in place thereof, in each instance, the following words:-

98           "persons with a disability".

99           SECTION 18. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
100 amended by inserting after the definition of "Construction" the following definitions:-

101           "Facility", all or any portion of a building, structure, site improvement, complex,  
102 equipment, road, walk, passageway, parking lot or other real or personal property, including the  
103 site where the building, property, structure or equipment is located."

104           "Gut Rehabilitation", the general replacement of the interior of a building that may or  
105 may not include changes to structural elements such as flooring systems, columns or load  
106 bearing interior or exterior walls.

107           SECTION 19. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
108 amended by striking out, in line 200, the words "Physically handicapped person" and inserting in  
109 place thereof the following words:-

110           "Person with a disability".

111           SECTION 20. Said section 13A of said chapter 22, as so appearing, is hereby further  
112 amended by striking out, in line 204, the words "Physically handicapped persons" and inserting  
113 in place thereof the following words:-

"A person with a disability."
