In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to option (D) beneficiaries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 12 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the first paragraph, in lines 151 to 157,
- 3 inclusive, and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:-
- 4 Option (d), Member Survivor Allowance. At any time a member, upon his written
- 5 notice on a prescribed form filed with the board prior to his death, may nominate one or more
- 6 eligible beneficiaries as set forth under option (c) of this section, who if such member dies before
- 7 being retired shall receive a portion, as specified on said form, of the yearly amount of the option
- 8 (c) allowance to which such member would have been entitled had his retirement taken place on
- 9 the date of his death; provided that, in the event that multiple beneficiaries are nominated, the
- benefit will be calculated using the youngest beneficiary's age at the time of the member's death;

- provided further, that upon the death of a beneficiary, all payments to surviving beneficiaries
- shall remain unchanged.
