#### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to creditable service.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1: Notwithstanding Chapter 32 of the General Laws, or any other general or
- 2 special law to the contrary, the Massachusetts Teachers' Retirement System shall allow Daniel P.
- 3 Schwemin, a member who did not pay or make provisions for repayment installments, into the
- 4 annuity saving fund of the system, make-up payments of an amount equal to the accumulated
- 5 regular deductions withdrawn by him, together with buyback interest, within 1 year after April 2,
- 6 2012, and whose creditable service predates January 1, 1986, shall not be required to pay
- 7 actuarial interest, but rather the regular interest thereon. The repayment shall be made in one
- 8 lump sum or in installments as the Massachusetts Teachers' Retirement System shall prescribe.
