In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to Massachusetts General Laws chapter 32: retirement and pensions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1: Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, Section 1 of
- 2 Chapter 32 is hereby amended by adding the following new paragraph at the end of the definition
- 3 for "regular compensation"; Regular compensation shall include all overtime paid to any
- 4 employee as defined by this chapter, who was required to, or volunteered to, work outside their
- 5 home during the COVID 19 pandemic state of emergency that commenced on March 10, 2020
- 6 until the conclusion of the COVID 19 state of emergency.
- 7 The state human resources administrator shall compile a list of all employees eligible for
- 8 overtime under this chapter and transmit it to the state retirement board.
