**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act relating to access to public records.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 7 of Chapter 66 of the General Laws, is hereby amended by
2 inserting at the end thereto the following sentence: All records in the custody of the state
3 secretary shall be open to public inspection and available for copying after the expiration of
4 ninety years from creation of the record.

5 SECTION 2. Section 2A of Chapter 46 of the General Laws, is hereby amended by
6 striking out, in the first sentence, the words “children born out of wedlock or” and “or those of
7 persons born out of wedlock”.
