## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act to modernize participation in public meetings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Section 18 of chapter 30A of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2	inserting after the first paragraph the following paragraph:-

3 "Adequate, alternative means of public access", measures or means that provide 4 transparency and permit timely and effective remote public access to the deliberations of a public body; provided, however, such means include but are not limited to providing public access 5 6 through telephone, internet, or satellite-enabled audio or video conferencing or any other 7 technology that enables the public to clearly follow and participate in the proceedings of the 8 public body as they are occurring, and must be available without any subscription, toll, or similar 9 charge; provided, further, where allowance for active, real-time participation by members of the 10 public is a specific requirement of a general or special law or regulation, or a local ordinance or 11 by-law, pursuant to which the proceeding is conducted, any alternative means of public access 12 must provide for such participation.

13	SECTION 2. Section 20 of said chapter 30A, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
14	striking out paragraph (a) and inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:-
15	(a) Except as provided in section 21, all meetings of a public body shall be open to the
16	public in a public place that is open and physically accessible to the public, and provide
17	adequate, alternative means of public access.
18	SECTION 3. Section 20 of said chapter 30A, as so appearing, is hereby further amended
19	by inserting at the end thereof the following paragraph:-
20	(i) A municipal public body that for reasons of economic hardship and despite best efforts
21	is unable to provide alternative means of public access that will enable the public to follow the
22	proceedings of the municipal public body as those activities are occurring in real time may
23	request a hardship waiver from the attorney general's office. If such waiver is granted, the
24	municipal public body shall post on its municipal website a full and complete transcript,
25	recording, or other comprehensive record of the proceedings as soon as practicable upon
26	conclusion of the proceedings, and in any event within 10 business days. This paragraph shall
27	not apply to proceedings that are conducted pursuant to a general or special law or regulation, or
28	a local ordinance or by-law, that requires allowance for active participation by members of the
29	public.
30	SECTION 4. Section 22 of said chapter 30A, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
31	inserting at the end of the first paragraph the following sentence:-

32 The minutes shall note the adequate, alternative means of public access to the meeting,33 pursuant to paragraph (a) of section 20.

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
