An Act relative to electric bicycle rebates.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 95 of chapter 142 of the session laws of 2019 is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting after the words "not more than \$50,000" the following language: The department of
- 3 energy resources shall establish new rebates up to \$500 for general consumers and up to \$750 for
- 4 low- and moderate-income consumers and not more than forty percent of retail price for the
- 5 purchase of new and used electric bicycles. The department of energy resources shall evaluate
- 6 offering electric bicycle rebates at the point of sale through Massachusetts owned and operated
- 7 bicycle retailers.
