In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act to prevent biomass energy to protect the air we breathe.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 11F of Chapter 25A of the general laws, as so appearing in the 2018
- 2 official edition, is hereby amended:

by means of conservation and recreation, for forest-derived biomass, requirements that fuel shall be provided by means of sustainable forestry practices; provided, however, that the department shall adopt any existing or new biomass fuel sustainability standards if deemed appropriate by the department after a public comment process."

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon enactment and apply to any facility that begins commercial operation after December 31, 2020, or any existing facility that increases its generating capacity, or any facility which modifies its fuel feedstock to include wood-derived biomass, after December 31, 2020.
