An Act relative to online driver's education.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 32G of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the first sentence of the last paragraph, in  
3 line 214, the following sentence:-

4           Bill text: The registrar may approve a driver education curriculum presented in an online  
5 teaching format.

6           And Section 8 of chapter 90, lines 13 and 14 are hereby amended by deleting “not less  
7 than 6 hours of observing another student driver.”
