**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court
(2021-2022)**

An Act relative to electronic toll payments.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1: Section 13 of Chapter 6C of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 adding, after paragraph (c) the following paragraph:-

3 “(d) Information on tolls, including, where applicable, toll usage, tolls due, balance, late
4 and other fees, fines, penalties, and other amounts due associated with toll or other transactions,
5 as well as payment options, shall be made available through an online database that is searchable
6 by both (i) vehicle registration number, and (ii) date of toll assessment, within one business day
7 of the toll being assessed. Information for accessing the online database shall be printed on a sign
8 visible to the driver at the point where the toll is assessed. No invoice issued by the department
9 to a vehicle’s registered owner of record or responsible party for purposes of collecting tolls shall
10 be mailed fewer than 7 days after the assessment of the toll.”
