**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court  
(2021-2022)**

An Act relative to establishing the Massachusetts Medal of Fidelity.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 33 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official Edition,  
2 is hereby amended by inserting after section 67A the following section:-

3 Section 67B. There shall be a Massachusetts medal of fidelity to be presented to the next  
4 of kin of a service member or veteran who died as the result of either combat-related post-  
5 traumatic stress disorder or a service-connected disease, condition or injury related to the  
6 exposure to harmful toxins, herbicides, agents or materials, where the exposure occurred while  
7 serving in the armed forces of the United States, active or reserve components, or the  
8 Massachusetts National Guard. A service member must have entered military service or state  
9 active duty from the commonwealth, have been a resident of the commonwealth at the time of  
10 death or have been a member of the Massachusetts national guard at the time of death. To be  
11 eligible, a service member or veteran must have served after December 6, 1941. The adjutant  
12 general or designee and 2 field grade officers of the armed forces of the commonwealth detailed

13 by the commander-in-chief shall constitute a commission to make recommendations to the  
14 commander-in-chief for the awarding of the Massachusetts medal of fidelity.

15 SECTION 2. Section 1 shall take effect on October 11, 2021.
