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**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

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**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court  
(2021-2022)**  
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An Act relative to the sale of fresh produce by restaurants.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, in order to  
2 address disruptions caused by the outbreak of the 2019 novel coronavirus, also known as  
3 COVID-19, during the governor’s March 10, 2020 declaration of a state of emergency,  
4 Massachusetts restaurants shall be permitted to sell fresh produce, meats, and other whole foods.  
5 Restaurants that choose to sell fresh produce as permitted by this act shall adhere to all federal,  
6 state, and local health and safety laws regarding the sale of fresh produce and other whole foods.
