An Act relative to transparency in health club cancellation policies.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 81 of Chapter 93 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof, the following:-

3           Provided, that health clubs who have two-hundred members or less under contract, and  
4 who use websites for the execution of their business, shall have a conspicuous option on their  
5 website where members may immediately cancel their membership contracts.
