## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to dentistry licensure examinations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by striking out section 47 and inserting in place thereof the following section:
- 3 Section 47. The examination may be written or oral or both, at the option of the board,
- 4 and may include the principal subjects taught in reputable dental colleges. Demonstrations in
- 5 operative and prosthetic dentistry, diagnosis and prognosis may be required; provided, however,
- 6 that the examination shall not require the performance of any procedure upon a live patient.
- 7 SECTION 2. Not later than July 1, 2023, the board of registration in dentistry shall
- 8 approve an examination that does not require the performance of any procedure upon a live
- 9 patient. Until such time, the board shall continue to approve the current examination including
- 10 the performance of an irreversible procedure upon a live patient.
