In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act promoting radon testing.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Notwithstanding any general or special law, rule or regulation to the contrary, the
2	department of public health, in consultation with the department of elementary and secondary
3	education and the department of early education and care, shall promulgate regulations to require
4	that, subject to appropriation, all child care programs, as licensed or authorized by the
5	department of early education and care, and public schools undergo routine radon testing.
6	Testing schedules, documentation of testing, standards for acceptable radon levels and plans for
7	mitigation of unacceptable levels of radon shall be determined, and made public, by the
8	department of public health within 1 year of the enactment of this bill.
