## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act protecting children's programs.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

Chapter 138 of the General Laws is amended by inserting after Section 78 the following
 section:-

3 Section 79. Any not-for-profit corporation owning or operating a skating facility in the 4 Commonwealth that has been granted, transferred, or otherwise authorized, as of July 1, 2020, to 5 possess or obtain an all-alcohol liquor license or any other type of liquor license, authorized by 6 this chapter, shall be suspended, unless and until the Commission certifies and reports in writing 7 to the House and Senate Committees on Ways and Means and the Joint Committee on Consumer 8 Protection and Professional Licensure, that any such skating facility provides: 9 (i) a minimum of 20 hours of weekday ice time per week to any girls and boys high 10 school hockey program during its season, free of charge, as a community benefit, in the 11 municipality in which the skating facility is situated or any such facility where such corporation 12 is headquartered; and

(ii) a minimum of 10 hours of weekday ice time per week to the not-for-profit girls and
boys youth hockey program during its season, free of charge, as a community benefit, in the
municipality in which the skating facility is situated or any such facility where such corporation
is headquartered;
