## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to the reserve time of public safety personnel in the city of Revere.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Notwithstanding paragraph (o) of subdivision (1) and paragraphs (b) and (c)
- of subdivision (2) of section 4 of chapter 32 of the General Laws or any other general or special
- 3 law to the contrary, the Revere retirement board shall provide creditable service for the reserve
- 4 or permanent-intermittent service of certain public safety personnel in the city of Revere without
- 5 payment for such creditable service. The Revere retirement board shall provide creditable service
- 6 for the reserve, permanent-intermittent or call service of any member of the Revere fire
- department who was a member of the Revere retirement system on or before February 11, 2020
- 8 without payment for such service.
- 9 SECTION 2. This bill shall take effect upon its passage.
