Scanlon, Jack Patrick Lewis, Carmine Lawrence Gentile and other members of the General Court for legislation to ensure the health and safety of the commonwealth's students and educators; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3716) of James K. Hawkins, Tami L. Gouveia and others to ensure the health and safety of students, educators and communities during the 2019 novel coronavirus pandemic; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3738) of Jon Santiago and others relative to the rapid, accessible and equitable administration of the COVID-19 vaccine; and the petition (accompanied by resolve, House, No. 4031) of Nika C. Elugardo for legislation to establish financial welfare, housing security and discrimination protection for college students during the COVID-19 pandemic, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 4938) ought to be adopted.

3 and study of Senate document numbered 250 and House documents numbered 3716, 3738 and
4 4031, relative to COVID-19.

6 and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
7 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives
8 on or before December 31, 2022.
